Assessment specifications:

All evidence presented in this skill standard must be in accordance veterinary guidelines and farm procedures.

Akonga/learners' evidence must be collected using naturally occurring evidence.

All activities and evidence must meet the requirements of farm procedures, accepted industry practice, legislation and any subsequent amendments.

All activities relevant to this standard should reflect ngā kaupapa (the principles) o te Tiriti o Waitangi.

All activities should, as relevant to candidates and/or this standard, reflect the peoples of other cultures, and their world views.

Range

Learners should have access to animal health equipment (needles, medicines, records), facility manuals, and veterinary treatment protocols. Products and protective gear must meet regulatory standards.

Evidence may include observation of treatment administration, review of health records or treatment logs, oral questioning on disease identification, and demonstrated response to a staged health issue.

Definitions

Veterinary guidelines advice received directly from veterinarians, or literature recommended by veterinarians.

Programme the husbandry and management procedures required for feeding, maintaining health, housing and welfare of pigs for example, standard operating procedures.

Farm procedures refer to the policies and procedures set out in a verbal or written form by the employer or organisation.

Accepted industry practice refers to approved codes of practice and standardised procedures accepted by the wider industries as examples of best practice.

Herd a group of pigs managed together on a farm, including breeding stock and growing pigs.

Herd size the total number of pigs in the herd, often measured by the number of breeding sows or overall pig count.

It is recommended that people complete New Zealand Certificate in Pork Production (Stockperson) with an optional strand in Farrowing Care (Level 3) [Ref: 2525]

Identify Health Issues & Prevention

 Common health issues: gastric ulcers, pneumonia, lameness, erysipelas, scours, sarcoptic mange, PMWS. • Prevention strategies: vaccination, regular deworming, hygiene/disinfection routines, strict biosecurity (visitor limits, quarantine).

Implement Herd Health Practices

- Establish structured programs: vaccination schedules, parasite-control protocols.
- Routine sanitation: facility and equipment cleaning and disinfection.
- Daily health monitoring and detailed record-keeping of checks, treatments and incidents.
- Manage medications and veterinary supplies on-hand (e.g., needles, medication storage, checking shelf life, maintaining inventory, disposal of expired products)

Recognize & Respond to Illness

- Detect signs: coughing, sneezing, scours, skin lesions, lameness, lethargy, or appetite loss.
- Remedial actions: isolate affected animals, administer treatments per veterinary guidance, euthanasia, engage veterinary support for diagnostics and severe cases.

Manage Environment & Welfare

- Environmental controls: maintain optimal temperature, provide cooling options, adequate ventilation, appropriate stocking density, bedding and cleanliness.
- Compliance: adhere to Code of Welfare and ACVM Act requirements for chemical and medication use.
